

### **2012 Mail-In Registration Instructions**

- 1) Confirm that you reside within South Portland American Little League boundaries. See enclosed street listings as reference. If you reside within SPALL boundaries, continue. If you do not reside within SPALL boundaries, consult South Portland National Little League.
- 2) Confirm your child's League Age. See enclosed Little League Age Charts as reference.
- 3) Determine which the division(s) in which you will be registering your child(ren). See enclosed divisions information as reference.
- 3) Complete enclosed Medical Release Form. Please note required fields must be complete in order for your child to participate.
- 4) Review and sign the enclosed Code of Conduct.
- 5) Complete the enclosed Player Registration Form. Please note the form requires signature verifying your review of waivers. Please contact the Registration Officer as outlined in the "Contact Us" section of the [www.spallweb.com](http://www.spallweb.com) website with questions about divisions. You may also send inquiries to [info@spallweb.com](mailto:info@spallweb.com).
- 6) Make a copy of your child's birth certificate. A copy of the player's birth certificate is required for participation. If you are registering a returning player and have previously provided a birth certificate copy, you need not submit another copy. A copy is required for all players new to the League.
- 7) Make a copy of material verifying current address within SPALL boundaries (e.g., bill, library statement, etc).
- 8) Checks should be made payable to "SPALL" per the fee schedule outlined below:

Tee-Ball & Jr/Sr Softball: \$60 per player.

All other divisions: \$75 per player thru 2/28/12; \$15 per player 3/1/12 and after.

Raffle fee per family: \$15.00 (3 tickets)

For example, a family registering a child for tee-ball and a child for minor softball will have a total registration/raffle fee of \$15.00 (\$60 tee-ball + \$75 minor softball + \$15 family raffle).

### MAJOR BASEBALL

All players ages 9 to 12 that are not currently on a Major league roster are invited to try out in March every year. The players are scored at tryouts in the areas of running, hitting, throwing, and fielding. Players not currently on a roster are drafted into open slots on each team at the end of March. This Division follows all Little League Rules which uses a 60 foot diamond and a pitching distance of 46 feet. Click on SCOREBOARD for the Teams in this Division. An All-Star Team is chosen of 11-12 year olds in this Division which has the opportunity to advance to the LL World Series in Williamsport, PA. Click Here for the Teams in this Division.

### AAA MINOR BASEBALL

This division is comprised of 9 to 12 year old players who have completed at least one year of AA Minor Baseball and/or shows the skills to compete at this level and have completed the tryout process but have not been drafted by a major league team. It is hoped by creating this division we will be able to offer a higher level of competition and instruction. This will be a player pitch Division allowing the players to become familiar with the LL rules, develop pitching experience and fine tune their baseball skills. Players from this division will also be available for call up to a major league team if a vacancy occurs at that level. Click Here for the Teams in this Division.

### AA MINOR BASEBALL

This division is comprised of 7 and 8 year old players who have completed at least one year of Rookie league and are a minimum League Age of 7 years old. It is hoped by creating this division we will be able to offer a level of competition and instruction that will be age and ability appropriate. This movement will also eliminate the prospect of 7 and 8 year olds competing with 11 year olds. ### ROOKIE BASEBALL

This is the next step for graduates of the Tee-Ball program comprised of 6 and 7 year old players. Players hit against machine pitched rubber coated baseballs, learn fundamentals, and play in non-competitive games. All players bat in each inning. There are 3 innings per game. ## **TEE-BALL BASEBALL**

This is an introductory program for boys and girls for their first experience at organized baseball. # Sport Parent Code of Conduct

We, the \_\_\_\_\_ Little League, have implemented the following Sport Parent Code of Conduct for the important message it holds about the proper role of parents in supporting their child in sports. Parents should read, understand and sign this form prior to their children participating in our league.

Any parent guilty of improper conduct at any game or practice will be asked to leave the sports facility and be suspended from the following game. Repeat violations may cause a multiple game suspension, or the season forfeiture of the privilege of attending all games.

## **Preamble**

The essential elements of character-building and ethics in sports are embodied in the concept of sportsmanship and six core principles:

- Trustworthiness,
- Respect,
- Responsibility,
- Fairness,
- Caring, and
- Good Citizenship.

The highest potential of sports is achieved when competition reflects these "six pillars of character."

## **I therefore agree:**

1. I will not force my child to participate in sports.
2. I will remember that children participate to have fun and that the game is for youth, not adults.
3. I will inform the coach of any physical disability or ailment that may affect the safety of my child or the safety of others.
4. I will learn the rules of the game and the policies of the league.
5. I (and my guests) will be a positive role model for my child and encourage sportsmanship by showing respect and courtesy, and by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, officials and spectators at every game, practice or other sporting event.
6. I (and my guests) will not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parent such as booing and taunting; refusing to shake hands; or using profane language or gestures.

7. I will not encourage any behaviors or practices that would endanger the health and well being of the athletes.
8. I will teach my child to play by the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.
9. I will demand that my child treat other players, coaches, officials and spectators with respect regardless of race, creed, color, sex or ability.
10. I will teach my child that doing one's best is more important than winning, so that my child will never feel defeated by the outcome of a game or his/her performance.
11. I will praise my child for competing fairly and trying hard, and make my child feel like a winner every time.
12. I will never ridicule or yell at my child or other participants for making a mistake or losing a competition.
13. I will emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit my child over winning. I will also de-emphasize games and competition in the lower age groups.
14. I will promote the emotional and physical well-being of the athletes ahead of any personal desire I may have for my child to win.
15. I will respect the officials and their authority during games and will never question, discuss, or confront coaches at the game field, and will take time to speak with coaches at an agreed upon time and place.
16. I will demand a sports environment for my child that is free from drugs, tobacco, and alcohol and I will refrain from their use at all sports events.
17. I will refrain from coaching my child or other players during games and practices, unless I am one of the official coaches of the team.

#### 2. FOR RETURNING PLAYERS TO SPALL:

Upon request of League Officials, I/We will show the above named candidate's proof of legal residence and an original or state certified copy of his/her birth certificate.

#### 3. FOR ALL:

I/We understand that our child (candidate) must be eligible under the residence and age regulations of Little League Baseball, Incorporated, to participate in this local league, and that if any controversy arises regarding residence and/or age, the decision of the Charter Committee in Williamsport shall be final and binding. I/We further understand that if any participant on a Little League Team does not qualify for participation in the league based on residence (as defined by Little League Baseball, Incorporated) and/or age, such participant and/or team on which he/she participates be found ineligible, and forfeit(s) and/or suspension of Tournament privileges may be decreed by action of the Charter Committee or Tournament Committee.

### RAFFLE:

South Portland American Little League will be holding its annual raffle ticket fundraiser. Once again, a portion of the funds will be used as prizes while the remainder will be used for capital improvements and to purchase uniforms, insurance and equipment. This year, in order to secure the necessary funding, each family will be responsible for buying a minimum of three tickets (i.e. \$5 each for a total of \$15). A family has the option to write their name on the ticket(s) and enter the drawing or they may choose to resell the tickets, in order to recoup their \$15, and allow the new buyer to enter the drawing. Again, each FAMILY will be required to purchase 3 tickets; each family need NOT purchase 3 tickets per child.
